## COLLEGE READINESS CHECKLIST

#### 9<sup>th</sup> Grade

- Get involved in activities you care about-at school and after school (including sports, clubs, community service, jobs, etc.) List them later, on your college applications. Colleges love to see that dedication.
- Think about your current interest. What career fields might match up with them? As you get new ideas, write them down.
- Plan to take the most challenging (and realistic) course loads for which you are eligible. The classes you take in high school can set the foundation for college courses.
- Begin your college and career search. Go to FloridaShines and My-CareerShines to research colleges, majors and careers that interest you.

#### 10<sup>th</sup> Grade

- Go to <u>www.collegeboard.com</u> & sign up for a free student account. Once you do this, go to "My Organizer: and it will help you with your "to-do" list for tests and applications. Take it step by step. It's easier than it looks!
- Your GPA counts! Stay on track with your courses. If you're strug-
- gling, ask for help. Plan a challenging 11<sup>th</sup> grade course load. Be sure to contact one of your school counselors to discuss Dual Enrollment courses
- Look for summer opportunities that give you a taste of the college experience.
- Begin your college and career search. Go to FloridaShines and MyCareerShines to research colleges, majors and careers that interest you.
- Get involved in clubs/sports/your interests, volunteer and take practice tests. Stay ahead of everything you'll have to do.

#### 11<sup>th</sup> Grade

- Make a special folder marked "College" with everything connected to your college planning. Keep those grades up! Junior year grades are very important in
- College admissions. If you are having trouble, ask for help. Make a list of 6-8 colleges (2 or 3 safety schools that will most likely
- accept you, 2 dream schools and 2or 3 in between) Discuss these choices with your parents/guardians and counselors if possible.
- Look for summer opportunities that give you a taste of the college experience.
- Contact individuals you will be asking to write letters of recommendations.
- Take tours, virtually or in person.
- Use the average test scores and GPAs from your list of schools to set a goal for ACT/SAT scores. Then study up and take as many as possible!
- \* If you are currently dual enrolled, now is a time to look at possible future majors to make sure you're on track!

#### 12<sup>th</sup> Grade

- Maintain your second semester grades & beware of "Senioritis"-Colleges can withdraw their acceptances if your grades decline drastically.
- Find out admission acceptance/enrollment fees & deadlines, write them down so when you've made your decision and are able you can pay them.
- By May 1<sup>st</sup> make your decision about what college you will attend and notify that school of your acceptance. Be sure to also notify the schools whose offers you are declining.
- Budget for college. Make a spreadsheet with your FAFSA, Bright-Futures and other scholarship amounts and estimate the costs for tuition, books and other expenses, so you have an idea of your outof-pocket costs.
- Take a virtual tour of the college of your choice and start any orientations or welcomes the school requires
- Pay for and confirm housing, GRADUATE, CHECK YOUR EMAIL AND COLLEGE PORTALS DAILY, and start packing for college!
